DIVE SHOP PROCEDURES

WHAT TO EXPECT WHEN YOU ARRIVE AT THE DIVE SHOP

- Staff and dive guests should wear a face cover (mask, bandana or scarf).
- No more than six (6) guests are allowed in the retail shop at any given time.
- Divers must follow social distancing guidelines when purchasing dive services, merchandise or during dive check-ins.
- Only group leaders may present group paperwork at check-in.
- Orientation will be given at pre-arranged times and no more than ten (10) divers may attend orientation, outside on the deck, at any given time.
- Divers must follow social distancing guidelines during orientation.
- Check-in for all dives will be at a prearranged time and no more than ten (10) divers are allowed on the dock at one time.

SHORE DIVING PROCEDURES

WHAT TO EXPECT WHEN YOU SHORE DIVE WITH US

- Tanks will be placed at designated locations to maintain social distancing.
- Divers are not allowed to share equipment or let their equipment be touched by another diver.
- Divers should avoid touching any hard surfaces and their face as much as possible.
- Divers who need assistance getting into and out of their equipment, on or off the dock, or need assistance after getting out of the water, should have a personally designated "dive buddy."
- Divers must maintain at least six (6) feet distance when clearing their nose, sinuses or throat at the surface or after a dive.
- Divers should maintain social distancing when entering the water and avoid crowding together on the surface.
- Divers must practice good hygiene and avoid spitting into their masks, blowing their noses, etc.
- Divers must assemble and disassemble their own dive equipment.







BOAT DIVING PROCEDURES

WHAT TO EXPECT WHEN YOU BOAT DIVE WITH US

- All Individual divers will be combined with groups and placed on a designated boat.
- No more than ten (10) divers allowed per boat.
- No non-divers are allowed on the boat.
- Boarding procedures will be organized and prearranged to maintain social distancing.
- Captains, crew members and divers should wear a face covering (mask, bandana or scarf).
- Dive staff must have all equipment on board before divers are allowed to board.
- Any personal items or equipment not specifically needed for diving or safety, will not be allowed on board.

- Everyone on board should avoid touching any hard surfaces and their face as much as possible.
- Divers are not allowed to share equipment or let their equipment be touched by another diver.
- Tanks will be placed at designated locations on the boat to maintain social distancing.
- Divers must assemble and disassemble their own dive equipment.
- Divers who need assistance getting into and out of their equipment, on or off the boat from the water, or need assistance after a dive, should have a personally designated "dive buddy" on the boat.

- Divers must maintain social distancing when entering the water, when they are together on the surface and when getting back on board the boat.
- Divers must maintain at least six (6) feet distance when clearing their nose, sinuses or throat at the surface or after a dive.
- Divers must practice good hygiene on the boat and avoid spitting into their masks, blowing their noses, etc.
- Handrails, communal surfaces and the marine head will be sanitized before, during and after each boat charter.
